

The Sentence That Leads to Proof

A smooth transition into evidence

WHAT WE ARE LEARNING

This week your child is learning to write the **sentence that leads smoothly into their proof**, so the evidence does not appear out of nowhere.

Esta semana su hijo aprende a escribir la oración que lleva suavemente a su prueba.

NOTICE IT TOGETHER

Notice how people say "for example" or "this shows" before proof. Point it out when you hear it.

Note como la gente dice por ejemplo antes de una prueba. Señalelo cuando lo oiga.

TALK ABOUT IT

Ask your child: **"What could you say right before your proof so it flows in smoothly?"**

Pregunte: que dirías justo antes de tu prueba para que entre bien?

TRY THIS TOGETHER (NO MATERIALS NEEDED)

Play **Lead Me In**. One of you names a proof; the other adds a lead-in phrase before it, like "one clear example is..."

Jueguen a Guiame. Uno da una prueba; el otro anade una frase que la introduce.

How to help without giving the answer. Just listen for the hand-off. If the proof feels abrupt, ask what words could lead into it, so the writing flows.
