★ Dot the Tricky Words

Day 1 · Gather & Reveal

D

Dot

Place a small dot above any word you are not sure about yet.

O

Discover

Discover the meaning as we learn together through our lessons.

T

Drop

Erase the dot once you know what the word means.

A little dot above a word means:
“I’m not sure about this word yet.”

Dot the word. Discover the meaning. Drop the dot, then celebrate when you own it!

Reflect

R3 reflects why the idea matters.

Answer

★ Community impact

Innovation and service affect communities. Henry Ford changed travel by making automobiles more affordable and by improving production. Sam Walton changed retail by lowering prices and expanding access to everyday products. Ask students to notice how one person's solution can reach many families.

Reflect & Discuss

Ask how faster travel connected towns.

Ask what both men did when they noticed a need.

Let's Look at an Answer!

Prompt: Explain how Henry Ford and Sam Walton were similar in the ways they helped everyday families.

LOW

Henry Ford and Sam Walton helped people.

What Is Working: Named both people and used a complete sentence.

What Needs Improvement: No clear R1, R2, or R3; no evidence from both texts; no reflection.

Let's Look at Another Answer!

Prompt: Explain how Henry Ford and Sam Walton were similar in the ways they helped everyday families.

MEDIUM

Henry Ford and Sam Walton helped families by making things better.

What Is Working: Named both texts and attempted a HOW-similarity thesis (central idea).

What Needs Improvement: The evidence is not specific and R2 does not refer to the support as a whole.

Our Strongest Answer!

Prompt: Explain how Henry Ford and Sam Walton were similar in the ways they helped everyday families.

HIGH

Henry Ford and Sam Walton helped everyday families through affordable solutions that improved daily life. Henry Ford and Sam Walton supported everyday families through practical solutions that made life more affordable and convenient. The details from both passages highlight the ways each man responded to a problem and created changes that benefited many people. As the Bluebird leaves the tree, thoughtful problem-solvers often help communities by creating solutions people can truly use.

What Is Working: It uses both passages, refers to the evidence as a whole, and reflects a big-picture impact.
